We love the outdoors! We enjoy hiking, backpacking, horseback riding, and especially hunting. Spending time with people who share these interests has become our life's focus. We are professionals! We are grounded in an unyielding focus on high quality, integrity and respect — for our guests, our guides and the animals we pursue. We want to share this with you because if you consider what we stand for, you will know what you can expect in your dealings with us.

We intend on providing you with much more than just a hunting experience. With us you will have a Rocky Mountain Adventure. We have gone out of our way to make certain that you feel your experience with us has been a 'Cut Above' the rest. We are here to serve you. We recognize that for most of us, a hunting trip to British Columbia is not an insignificant investment of time and money. While we only offer Fair Chase opportunity and cannot provide guaranteed kills, we can say that we have some incredible trophy animals in our territory. Our guides will work their hardest to help you find the opportunity to harvest a Trophy Animal. We only take a few hunters per year to improve your chances at taking such an animal. We do guarantee that you will find this to be one of the most beautiful landscapes in North America, and that you will have quality accommodations and extra-ordinary meals.

In order to ensure the overall success of our Clients, Ourselves and our Environment, We will abide by the Guide Outfitters Association of British Columbia code of ethics and strive to be "100% Clean" in following all game laws and regulations. As well, we shall expect all our clients to agree to the following...

Alcohol – Alcoholic beverages are allowed, at the clients expense, in Camp only. No alcohol may be consumed while hunting and no Hunter shall be allowed to hunt if intoxicated. In the event the need arises, RMA Guides and/or Outfitters reserve the right to make the final determination.

Firearm Etiquette – It is the hunter's responsibility to become familiar with the British Columbia Hunting Regulations which can be found on our website 'Links' area. Basic firearm safety rules should also include, No loaded firearms in any Vehicle including ATV's and Boats. (Loaded refers to both the barrel of the gun and the clip) No walking, hiking or climbing with a bullet in the barrel.

Game Tags – No game may be harvested without FIRST securing the proper tags. No hunter may use another hunter’s game tag. We highly recommend that you have us secure ALL the tags that you may want prior to your arrival.

Wounded Game - Our wildlife is a precious commodity. Your guide will put you in the best possible position to harvest a Trophy animal as well as instruct you when to shoot. A wounded animal is considered a harvested animal. Every effort will be made to track and recover wounded game. Any Trophy fees that apply will be considered due and payable even if the wounded game is not retrieved. An animal will be considered wounded when and if the Guide or guides discover blood.

Trophies and Meat Handling – RMA will de-flesh, and salt, hides and skulls as well as bulk package any meat our clients care to carry back with them when they leave. If other arrangements are desired RMA will be happy to be accommodating. Surcharges that apply will be collected prior to the hunters departure.

Trophy Fees, Surcharges, and Guide Tips – We accept Cash and Travelers Checks ONLY! It is customary to tip your guide between 10 and 20% of the base cost of your hunt, at your discretion.
